# Tasmanian Beef Expo 2018

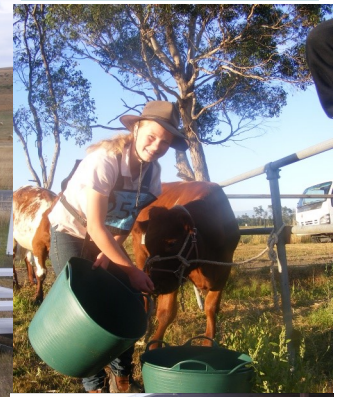
On the Thursday, 18 of January 2018, Ashtyn, Lizzie, Ruby and Candina travelled up to Deloraine with Mel and Miss Brown. We attended the Tasmanian Junior Beef Expo as exhibitors with our Cherry Tree Shorthorn Heifers that we've been training for the past couple of months. Ben Harman also came to expo with his own Santa Gertrudis Heifers.

The Expo consisted of three days of competition, workshops and fun games. There were 61 competitors aged 9 to 25 who all had their eye on the Simmental Heifer prize, making for some pretty stiff competition.

Over the course of the three days there were multiple competitions consisting of an All Breeds Heifer class, Cattle Assessment Challenge, Clipping & Fitting Competition, Barnyard Olympics and finally the Junior Heifer Handlers classes.

Overall we learnt an incredible amount about cattle and our Heifers improved in leaps and bounds. To top it all off we won three awards! Lizzie won Champion Junior Judge, Ashtyn won Reserve Champion Junior Judge and Candina won fourth Junior Judge. This was an awesome outcome as it was our first time competing in this type of competition. Ben also won his class in the All Breed Heifer competition.

We would like to thank Miss Brown for organising the whole excursion, Mel for driving the bus and putting up with us for four days. Also Charlotte for being our hairdresser and supporter. We are incredibly thankful to Helen White for giving us the chance to work with her amazing Heifers and supplying us with all the gear we could possibly need! ## Free meningococcal W vaccination Program for Years 10, 11 and 12

The Tasmanian Government is funding free meningococcal W vaccine in Term 1 for all students in Year 10 and for those students in Years 11 and 12 who did not get the vaccine in 2017. The vaccine provides protection against four strains of meningococcal disease (A, C, W and Y). Only one dose is required.

Parents/guardians of Year 10, 11 and 12 students will receive the Meningococcal W consent form coming home from school with your child early in Term 1 2018. Please read the information, and complete and return the form by 21 February 2018. It is important that all forms are completed and returned even if your child has had the vaccine or does not wish to receive it at school.

The vaccine is only free up to the 30 April 2018.

While meningococcal disease can affect people of any age, older teenagers are more likely to carry and spread the bacteria to others. The reason we are vaccinating 15 to 19 year olds is to reduce their risk of meningococcal W disease and to reduce the risk for the wider community.

The Tasman Council immunisation service may contact you about the meningococcal W vaccination program. Schools have been asked by the Director of Public Health to provide basic parent/guardian contact details to local councils for this purpose.

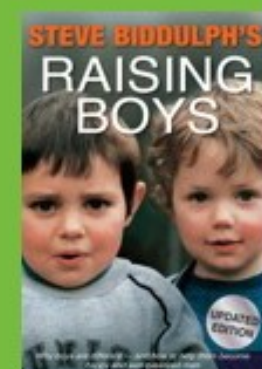
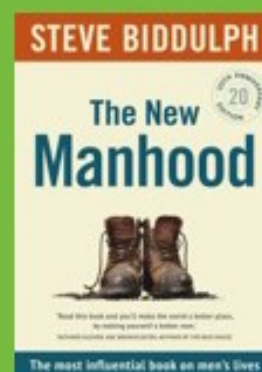
