Principal News

Well the wet and cold weather is signalling winter is almost here. It is hard to believe we are almost halfway through the year already. It is the time when sickness begins to spread quickly because we are in closer proximity to others being indoors for most of the day. We are reminding students to wash their hands before eating and after the toilet to reduce the spread of sickness across the school. If your child is sick then please keep them at home until the sickness has passed and let the office know. If your child is sick during the day at school we will be contacting you to come and pick them up from school. It is also a time when staff get sick and so we are thankful to our relief teachers who are able to be here to cover classes. On the chance that there is no relief to cover a class we may have to combine classes or spread students across the school with work to go on with. While this is not our preferred option it may be necessary. We thank you all for your patience and understanding during the winter months.

This week we have begun our Primary school activities during recess and lunchtime and it has been a great success. Primary students have the options of soccer, farm walks, scooters, board games and more. We are doing this to support students with intentional play and giving them options to understand how to play with each other and in a group. Most of these sessions are led by the Grade 6 students which provides them with leadership opportunities that they may not usually have.

During this week we have seen a huge reduction in behavioural issues in the Primary playground and have had significantly less issues being brought back to the classroom after recess and lunch. Thank you to all staff and students involved in making this happen.

Well done to all students who participated in the Cross Country last Friday, the chill came up and although the staff and parents were frozen the students were ready to race. Thank you to the Year 7 students who assisted with the younger grades. Thank you to Mrs Kinsella and Mr Chandler for your organisation and we look forward to seeing how the students perform in the interschool cross country.

Donation of books will be gratefully received.

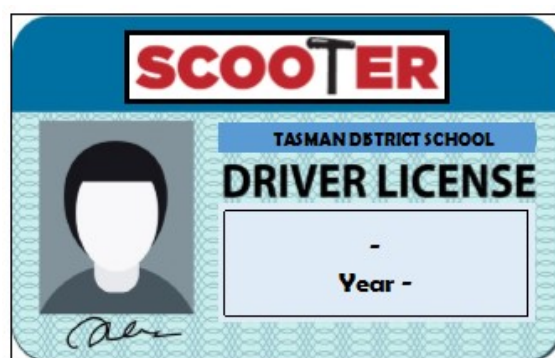

Tasman Aussie Hoops Program

The Tasman Aussie Hoops program has just begun in Nubeena with great excitement. With ambassadors like Lauren Jackson and Patrick Mills this national program offers plenty for the young sports people in the community.

Tasman Aussie Hoops is a fun sporting program for 5 to 10 year old boys and girls offering an introduction to basketball, we are the most southern program in the country. With a well-established positive and inclusive basketball culture it is no wonder that the 18 participants leave the basketball stadium at the end of each session with big smiles on their faces. The program not only offers the participants a chance learn the sport with their friends, it also provides an opportunity for a number of teenagers to coach the younger players.

Six local teenagers have generously volunteered to be the coaches for this program. Ilse B, Jorja D, Jocelyn M, Lizzie S, Patrick L and Melanie S are the first Tasman Aussie Hoops coaches. These six dedicated coaches have undergone their own nationally recognised training during sessions facilitated by Mr David Munns from Basketball Tasmania. These coaches are working fabulously well at delivering a fun program for younger kids. They work well collaboratively and enthusiastically together and are providing quality coaching, role models and mentoring for the participants.

The program will continue to run throughout the year with six week sessions being offered each term for both new and returning players.

The cost for new players is \$50 and for returning players the cost is \$15. These fees go to Basketball Tasmania and Basketball Australia for insurance and administration and also for a ball, bag and playing singlet for new players.

Further information will be provided prior to the next six week program.

Boston Children's Chorus – a FREE Performance at Port Arthur!

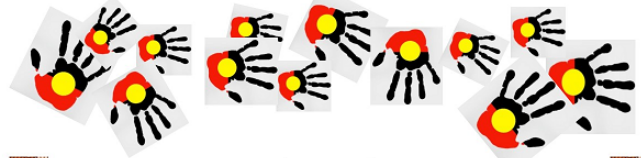

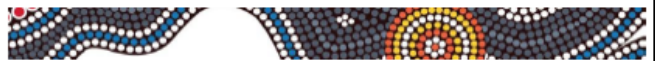
